## Criteria for Final Draft of Design A Bird

- 1. DRAWING: Make a drawing of your entire bird in color. Make sure to make the head, beak, wings, and feet clearly drawn so we can see the form and function of the different parts of your bird.
- 2. PLACEMENT OF DRAWING: Glue your drawing onto a bigger piece of paper.
- 3. HEADING: Write the name of your bird and the designer of the bird (you) at the top of the poster.
- 4. DATA ABOUT YOUR BIRD: Fill in an index card or type up a bulleted list of your bird's traits. See sample on back of sheet. .

You must include the following:

HABITAT: Where does your bird live? Does it migrate? If so, when and where? Note, all the other topics below depend on where the bird lives. Birds have to adapt to their surroundings to survive.

BEAK: Description of beak and how the form helps your bird survive

MARKINGS AND FEATHER COLOR (S): Description and explanation of how the markings and color help your bird to survive. Is there a difference in the color and markings of females and males?

─ WINGS/TAIL/ FLIGHT PATTERN: Description and explanation of how the shape, size, and flight pattern of your wings and tail help your bird to survive. Please note whether or not your bird migrates. If yes, say where and why. If not, how does it survive in the winter?

FEET: Description of the feet and an explanation of how the form of the feet helps your bird to survive. Think about what it eats and where it lives.

NEST: What is the nest made out of and where is it located? What does the location have to do with other aspects of your bird?

OPTIONAL:

- Eggs-size, color?
- What baby looks like compared to adult?
- Difference between male and female bird?
